



Dr. Rolf Kaiser

International Medical Project Leader for Phase I-III studies in Oncology, Boehringer Ingelheim, Biberach, Germany

Dr. Rolf Kaiser obtained a degree in chemistry and completed his medical degree, internship and doctoral thesis at the Free University of Berlin, Germany, where he held the Friedrich Naumann Stiftung scholarship. Dr. Kaiser then took up the post of Research Physician at the Department of Haematology/Oncology, University Clinic Benjamin Franklin, Free University of Berlin before joining the Institute of Clinical Pharmacology, Charité, Humboldt University of Berlin, where he worked as a Senior Scientist in the field of pharmacogenetics, researching drug metabolising enzymes and drug target structure. Subsequent to this, Dr. Kaiser joined the University Clinic Göttingen as head of the pharmacogenetic laboratory, where he was project leader for various oncology research projects, which included work in genotyping for several clinical research organisations and pharmacogenetic consulting. He joined Boehringer Ingelheim in 2004. Prior to this, Dr. Kaiser received Medical Specialist in Clinical Pharmacology certification, and later obtained university teaching credentials (major subject clinical pharmacology) from the Georg-August University of Göttingen, Germany, in 2005.

Dr. Kaiser has received several awards for teaching and research during his career, including the Antiemetic Research Award from the Multinational Association of Supportive Care in Cancer (MASCC) in 2003 for his work in exploring the role of pharmacogenetics in emesis. His research has been extensively published in a range of leading international peer-reviewed journals, including the *Journal of Clinical Oncology* and *The Lancet Oncology*.
